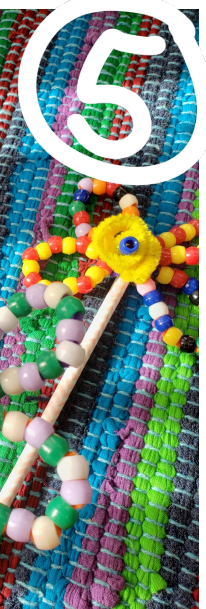
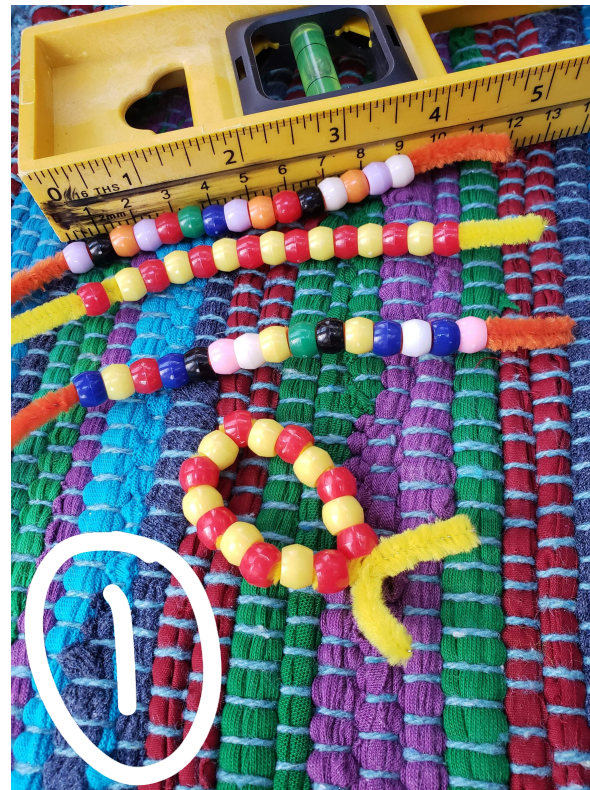


* Beaded Flower Wand with Filomena Jack

1. Put about 15 beads (or about 4 inches of beads) on each of 4 pipe cleaners to create the petals of the flower. Make a pattern or pick random colors.
2. Bend the 4 petals into ovals and twist the ends together.
3. Wrap part of a full pipe cleaner to create the stem and slip it into a straw.
4. Wind 1 half pipe cleaner into a circle and glue it to the center of the flower, adding a bead.
5. ENJOY!

Beaded Flower Wands

Project Materials List:

- **Pony beads (about 61 per wand)**
- **Paper straw**
- **Pipe cleaners, each wand requires 5 cleaners cut in half & 1 whole cleaner**
 - **WARNING: pipe cleaners can be a bit pokey, little fingers may need help bending the ends of them.**

Not Included in Art Kit:

- **White glue (Elmer's preferred)**
- **Scissors**
- **Rulers for measuring (not super important but helpful)**
